

BRAMSHALL VILLAGE PLAN

Bramshall Action Plan 2019 based on Parish Questionnaire results

Village environment

The majority of responses expressed a desire to maintain the rural village character of Bramshall.

Key points included the following

- retaining green space between Uttoxeter and Bramshall
- maintaining access to the countryside via footpaths from the village
- to avoid extensive house building
- the population is broadly supportive of limited and selective development

ACTION

The Parish Council will take into consideration these views when discussing future planning applications and where possible resist overdevelopment in the area.

The Parish Council will strive to maintain the green space between Bramshall and Uttoxeter to maintain the small village status.

Village facilities

There is a desire in the village community for a village shop.

We understand that Fibre Broadband is now available.

There was no majority regarding the need for a play area for older children.

ACTION

If any private individual were to consider this then they would be supported by the Parish Council

Traffic Issues and Road Maintenance

There was a strong concern from the parishioners regarding speeding traffic, level of traffic, type of vehicles, and road maintenance most noticeably on Stone Road, Stocks Lane, Leigh Lane, and Pigeonhay Lane.

ACTION

The Parish Council will continue to make approaches to the County Council and Borough Council regarding traffic calming measures and road maintenance.

There is a Community Speedwatch Programme in place and this will continue to be supported and the Parish Council would support an expansion of this programme.

To ensure the implementation of the chicane on Stone Road, Bramshall.

To continue to report and progress pothole repairs and maintenance.

To seek funding/grants for additional traffic calming installations, e.g. speed bumps, flashing signs.

Parishioners concerns

The consensus of opinion indicates that the villagers feel safe and have no major concerns regarding safety and crime.

There are concerns regarding dog fouling and litter/fly tipping.

ACTION

The Parish Council will endeavour to improve the situation by displaying more appropriate signage and notices in the parish magazine.

Litter picks are arranged and will continue.

The parishioners commented that there had been little contact from the local police/PCSO. The Parish Council to request that the local PCSO arranges a surgery in the village two to three times a year.
