- WORKING GROUP SPATH Flooding update/recommendations.
 Cllr slater withdrew from working group due to declaration of interest.
 Working Group report discussed and councillors RESOLVED to accept recommendations.
 - 1. Acknowledging the previous involvement of the Parish Council, it would seem appropriate to flag this issue with County Council, Highways dept and Severn Trent Water as something that has been raised as a continuing issue by the new owner of Brooklands and that it appears that the work discussed in 2016 was never completed. Request that they revisit the issue with the land-owner.
 - 2. Advise the landowner that he can take up the advice issued by the Highways Team, logged on the Parish Council Highways Log in April 2020. These logs are sent to Councillors by Clerk on a regular basis.
- Allotment Plot Holders Risk Assessment review and adopt.
 RESOLVED to issue with renewal contracts in January 2021.

 Severn Trent Grant – Allotments – Water Troughs, Fence repair, Wildflower Border.

17.06.2020 Clerk received confirmation that grant application for £5,936 had been successful.

Site visit took place on 23.06.2020 to decide on water trough positions – letters sent to plot 11a,10a,9a, 8a/b,7a/b requesting a 10ft working area to left with no produce from 1st November 2020, so water trough pipe and fence could be installed. Deadline for project to be finished – January 2021

A plot holder requested water trough at top of site, due to disability. Councillors discussed the request and RESOLVED to install the two troughs on plot 9a and 10a, as per site visit. This decision was taken as the water troughs need to service the greatest area of land on site.

Councillors RESOLVED to offer plot 3 to the enquiring plot holder, as it is opposite existing water trough on plot 12a.

Clerk guided Cllr Oulsnam regards to delegated powers to negotiate with plot holders on tenancy agreements. Any tenancy agreements changes to be brought to Council for resolution, before discussion with plot holders can take place. 26.06.2020 – confirmation that funds will be paid into bank within 4 working days. Draft press release sent to Severn Trent for review – final press release sent to Echo 03.07.2020.

- Staffordshire County Council pot hole repair system.
 Cllr Moore highlighted a repair that took place in Stramshall. The team arrived and only carried out repairs on two of the three pot holes.
 Councillors discussed the process for pot hole reporting and repairs and RESOLVED to write to Staffordshire County Council and include Kate Griffiths MP into the correspondence. Clerk to write and highlight that the current system of pot hole repair does not seem to be financially sensible, i.e.: to send a team out that does not repair all pot holes that are close together. Parish Council would like to suggest that the repair teams are sent out to a specific location and all pot holes repaired in one visit.
- Lloyds Internet Banking SLCC Staffordshire Clerk responses.
 Clerk obtained feedback from a range of Parish Council Clerks in Staffordshire about internet banking. Majority advised it saved time and was secure.
 RESOLVED by a vote of 7 to 2 to set up internet banking.
- Footpath 24, Creighton Lane, Stramshall.

A Resident requested the stile on Creighton Lane, Footpath 24 is dangerous and needs to be replaced.

Councillors RESOLVED to replace with the landowner's permission and install a two-step stile. By replacing this stile, it is hoped that residents will stop using the fence opposite the playing fields to access the footpath. RESOLVED to accept quote of £240+VAT from WH Durose for the works to be carried out.

B5013, Willslock – discuss historic request and current situation.
 The Parish Council received an email about speed limit on B5013. See correspondence below in 20.07.009.

Clerk provided the historic request to SCC about speed limit reduction. Councillors RESOLVED to contact SCC and propose a review of the speed limit, due to the exit of the Hazelwalls estate being planned for the B5013. Suggest that Speed limit be reduced from Red Cow Junction to Cullamore Lane to 40 mph, then from Cullamore Lane to Hazelwalls estate site entrance be 30 mph.

Clerk to research planning application for road layout proposed and approach SCC with the suggested changes and to liaise with Kingstone Parish Council and Uttoxeter Town Council for support.
